Purpose of AIM-Rifle Club (AIM-RC): The AIM-RC is an independent club formed exclusively to organize and conduct scheduled competition shooting events on the Legion Operator Training Group (Legion OTG) Known Distance (KD) range. AIM-RC is incorporated in the state of Florida and is licensed and insured to operate in Georgia.

Facilities: Legion-OTG is located near Blakely, Georgia. It is a private commercial business normally closed to the public. Legion-OTG provides training and facilities for Military and Law Enforcement agencies. Legion operates multiple training ranges including a conventional 1000 yard Known Distance (KD) range equipped with conventional targets pits and 25 cantilever target carriers. AIM-RC operates on the Shaw Range (1000 yard KD range) only.

Funding: AIM-RC is financially self-sustaining and poses no financial impact to Legion OTG. AIM-RC staff and volunteers will assist Legion OTG staff maintain the facility (mow grass, build targets, maintain pits, etc.). A general fund will be maintained to procure expendable supplies and equipment and pay out individual awards. Entry fee and award amounts will be established to ensure operational costs are sufficiently covered.

Conduct of Matches

1. AIM-RC will conduct both National Rifle Association (NRA) and Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) matches on the Known Distance (KD) range.
2. Monthly AIM-RC NRA matches will be registered with the NRA as “league” matches.
3. There will be a \$10 league joining fee assessed to all competitors upon registration during their first match of the league season, regardless of specific discipline.
4. The \$10 league joining fee will not be required from AIM-RC members in good standing...the fee is paid by their membership dues.)
5. NRA Regional matches, State Championships and CMP matches cannot be conducted via “league” format therefore, and entry fees will be set appropriately to cover reporting fees.

Range Specific Rules

1. All live fire activities are conducted under the direct control of an AIM-RC Match Director/Range Safety Officer (RSO).
2. The AIM-RC Chief Range Safety Officer develops, publishes, trains and maintains a Match Director instruction program and trains all Match Directors to the same standard.
3. Competitions are strictly controlled and conducted in accordance with official published rules and procedures of the operation.

Volunteer RSOs: To facilitate conduct of monthly league matches, the Chairman and Match Directors will recruit and train experienced competitors capable of calling line commands and directing match events.

League Match Awards:

To reward competitors for winning scores and to provide an incentive to fire frequent AIM-RC league matches, an "Incentive Point Program" has been established.

- a. The standard NRA awards schedule will be used (five to make class/category and places in each class/category.)
- b. Incentive Points earned will be indicated on match bulletins posted on the club web site.
- c. One Incentive Point equals a \$1 discount to be applied towards future league match entry.
- d. Incentive points are for discounts only and have no cash redemption value.
- e. Incentive Points apply to league entries only.

NOTE: To help defray the cost of the Silver Mountain Electronic scoring system and keep entry fees as low as possible, Incentive Points will not be credited for any electronically scored league match.

Membership Eligibility:

1. AIM-RC is a restricted membership club consisting solely of High Power Rifle competitors.
2. Applicants must follow Legion OTG, AIM-RC and NRA/CMP rules at all times.
3. A "hold harmless" agreement must be signed by the competitor prior to being allowed membership and/or range access.
4. Competitors who do not wish to join the AIM-RC may still compete in Regional and League matches as non-members.

Membership dues are \$50 annually.

1. Members who live 200 miles or more from the range will be granted two years membership privileges at the annual membership rate.
2. League members who perform volunteer duties to assist match conduct or range maintenance may be granted annual membership by the Chairman as long as they perform a minimum of three hours of service during the league. Membership will only be granted after work is performed.

Membership Benefits:

1. \$50 a night cabin rate for members (\$75 a night for non-members.)
2. Membership includes League Joining fee (non-members pay \$10 annually to join the league.)
2. Privilege to "continue to fire" under Match Directors oversight after daily league match completion for purposes of training, mentorship or zeroes (non-members will be assessed a \$10 fee to continue to fire).
3. Discounts on selected AIM-RC merchandise.

Member access during Non-Match days:

Members are not allowed range access during non-match days unless for range/target maintenance, and only when cleared by the Legion OTG staff.

AIM Rifle Club Options

Option A: Join AIM-RC

1. \$50 annual dues
2. Includes league initiation fee
3. Cabin rents are \$50 per night
4. Cabin rents are \$50 per night
5. Privilege to fire after match is complete (for training or zeroes)
6. Discounts on AIM-RC merchandise

Option B: Compete as non-member

1. \$10 league initiation fee will be assessed during first league match of the season.
2. Cabin rents are \$75 per night
3. Cabin rents are \$75 per night
4. Continuing to fire for training or zeroes after the match cost \$10
5. No discounts on AIM Merchandise
